

# **VPCI Playing Conditions for Petanque Clubs in Greater Metropolitan Melbourne**

**Effective as of Wednesday morning, 28 October 2020.**

These **Step 3** conditions will take effect on **Wednesday morning 28 October**, for any PFA-affiliated Petanque Club in Metropolitan Melbourne and Mornington Peninsula Shire, and limits the **maximum number of Players to 36**.

1. There is a strict 25 km travel limit within Greater Metropolitan Melbourne when going from home to a Petanque Club. However, you may not travel from Regional Victoria to a Petanque Club in Greater Metropolitan Melbourne (and that includes the Mornington Peninsula Shire), or from the Greater Metropolitan Melbourne to a Regional Petanque Club.
2. Each Petanque Club must put up a notice stating these conditions, or send an email to all Players in their Club stating these conditions.
3. Players, PFA-licenced or otherwise, who are Members of a Petanque Club, who do not accept all these conditions are not allowed to attend any Club and play Petanque.
4. No Player who feels unwell should visit their Petanque Club or any other Petanque Club under any circumstances.
5. Any Player in a high-risk category is encouraged to obtain additional expert advice about playing Petanque under the conditions spelt out in this note.
6. Petanque Club Rooms/Facilities are to be closed apart from allowing access to toilets and potable water.
7. No equipment may be shared or handled by others, and this includes boules, jacks and measuring tools.
8. Throwing rings are to be avoided if at all possible. If not, they must be handled by only one Player in a game and cleaned between games.
9. Clubs must retain records, including date and the names and contact details, including mobile phone numbers, of all people/Players attending each playing session.
10. A Petanque Club that is part of a larger Sporting Complex/Organisation must get permission from the overarching Committee of that Organisation indicating that these restrictions are acceptable, and if not adjust them accordingly and advise VPCI.
11. Clubs playing on terrain they do not own must get written permission from the owners of the land or from the Local Shire/Council, as appropriate.
12. Social distancing of at least 1.5 m between all people/Players in attendance at a Club must be adhered to at all times.
13. Face masks must be worn by all people/Players at the Club at all times. Clubs are to implement a strict “no masks – no play policy”. Players who cannot wear a mask as the result of a medical condition may play, but must provide a note from their doctor as to this situation.

14. Tissues and hand sterilising liquid must be made available by the Club during playing sessions.
15. For Petanque Clubs that have permanently marked pistes, the maximum number of Players allowed to attend any playing session, taking into consideration whether the games to be played will be Singles, Doubles or Triples, is limited to the number that can be accommodated on half the number of pistes available, and the games must be played on alternate pistes separated by a minimum of 3 m.
16. For Petanque Clubs that have free terrain, marks in the gravel must be made identifying the corners of 'marked' pistes no less than 3 m wide and 12 m long, and then the maximum number of Players, taking into consideration whether the games to be played will be Singles, Doubles or Triples, is limited to that number that can be accommodated on half the number of marked pistes available, and the games must be played on alternate pistes separated by a minimum of 3 m.
- 17. Regardless of the number of Players arrived at using Points 14 or 15 above, the maximum number of Players attending any playing session at a Petanque Club must not exceed 36 Players.**
18. During an organised playing session at a Petanque Club operating under these restrictions, there may be no additional spectators or observers at all.
19. However, the Petanque Club may have up to 2 (but no more) additional Officials/Committee Members present to organise games, and act as an umpire and/or scorer.
20. Club terrains should only be opened a few minutes prior to play, and the Club should then request all Players leave once play ends.
